Welcome back everyone!

I hope you have enjoyed your summer break and are ready for a great 2019/2020 school year!

I am excited to provide an update on Viking School's High School Redesign initiative, which we will be continuing at the Grade 7 - 12 level with some small adjustments. From 10:00 – 10:30 am each day all grade 7 -12 students will continue to have "High School Redesign" Block scheduled into their timetable. During this time students are able to work on homework or re-

ceive additional support from teachers. It is our expectation that **ALL** students will be in attendance during this time. Viking School made this a central part of our High School Redesign initiative based on feedback from students (including Principal's Advisory Council) and parents (including Parent Council) that students would like time during the day to access teachers for support in areas of need. Thank you for continuing to support this initiative and helping make student success a priority at Viking School.

At Viking School we are committed to getting feedback from students and accessing student voice. For 2019/2020 Mr. Madsen will again be operating a Principal's Advisory Council to allow students to meet with the Principal to discuss important issues and provide feedback. Students will have the opportunity to apply to be part of the council this month and two students will be selected from each Secondary (Grade 7 – 12) class.continued on pg 2

Our Early Dismissal/Staff Meeting days in 2019/2020 will feature an early dismissal of all students at 1:45 pm at the end of period 6 classes. The period order will rotate throughout the year with period 7/8 being missed in September. Early Dismissal/Staff Meeting days are the first Thursday of every month. We also have some small changes to our bell schedule for the 2019/2020 school year. Secondary students will start the day at 8:40 am, Elementary students at 8:35 am and dismissal for all students will now be at 3:11 pm.

Counselling services at Viking School will again be provided by the BRSD Career Counseling team and our Family School Liaison Worker. Mrs. Linda Kope will providing career counselling to students at Viking School this year and Georgina White will be our Family School Liaison Worker.

School photo day will be Thursday October 3rd. Photo re-takes will take place in November.

Viking School will again have a firm deadline dates for transferring between high school courses (for example from the -1 to -2 level). For the first semester this date will be October the 16th. I would ask that parents and students be mindful of this date and monitor progress in these courses with the classroom teacher as these dates do occur before the first report card is issued.

I would like to share a couple of important reminders related to provincial testing through Alberta Education. Schools in Alberta are no longer be required to seek division approval to provide accommodations on Diploma Exams and Achievement Tests. Schools will be able to provide/order all regularly accessed accommodations for students on these exams as decided upon in consultation with parents. Also of note, all grade twelve students will again be able to access double the usual allotted time for each diploma exam.



On Friday September 27th, the students and staff of Viking school will be participating in the Terry Fox Run. The run will take place in the last two blocks of the day. Grade 1 to 9 students will be participating in the run and Grade 10, 11 and 12 students will have regular classes during this time. Parents are welcome to attend and participate in this event.

Viking School will again be participating in the DeSimone Farms fruit sale fundraiser. Order forms will be available in October with product delivery in November. More information will be available closer to the beginning of the fundraising campaign.

AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM VIKING SCHOOL PARENT COUNCIL

Viking School Parent Council is in need of new members!

Parent Council plays a crucial role within our school. It is very important that parents understand the role that council fulfills. Probably the most important role is that council is a forum with communication and discussion with school administration about current issues. It is where your voice will be heard and definitely listened to. Members will be able to vote on important issues that influence the quality of education that your child receives: you can have a voice!

Parent Council is directly responsible for the Hot Lunch program. Without a proper functioning council, the Hot Lunch program will no longer exist.

Parent Council also pays for many things that parents may not be aware of:

Agendas for students in grade 1 to 6 are paid for by Parent Council.

Each year Parent Council gives money to every grade, Kindergarten to 12, to be used towards paying for bussing of field trips.

Parent Council sponsors the Grade 12 General Diploma Award.

We also sponsor students that request a donation for Encounters with Canada yearly.

Sadly, the attendance of parents and interest shown in the goings on in your child's school has diminished over the past couple of years. If we do not get enough members for a Parent Council, we may be downgraded to simply an advisory group to the principal. This group would only meet if the principal had the need to gather input from parents, but they have no voting right/say in any decision-making. If this should happen ALL benefits/sponsoring will fall away: there will be no Hot Lunch program and you as parents will be paying more from your own pocket for agenda's, bussing costs, etc.

Being part of Parent Council is NOT a big commitment. We meet on the second Wednesday of every month (excluding December and June) at 5:30pm for about an hour to an hour and a half. We get important information from our school administrators about issues such as staffing, program planning, budgeting, etc. There is always time for open discussions of new items. It truly gives you as the parent better insight into what goes on in our school.

As most of you (except for new Grade 4 parents) know, I use an on-line classroom messaging system, called ClassDojo. **This year I plan to use the Dojo only for my Elementary classes.** I will use the Dojo system to notify you of class announcements, such as test dates and content. There is a free app for you to download to receive these updates. If you were "connected" to this app last year you should still have it on your phone.

Last year almost all parents gave me their e-mail address. However, in accordance with Antispam laws, I need you to give me permission every year to continue to use this method of Home/School communication. If you were connected last year I have your e-mail address, but I still require your permission to use it again. Please let me know if the e-mail address you are now giving me is different from the one I already have, by just writing "new" beside it. If you would like reports sent to more than one e-mail address, please give me both addresses. This is helpful when both parents wish to receive the reports, especially if both parents don't live in the same home.

Therefore, please fill out and return the form below so that your child's weekly reports may still be sent to you. Or, you can message me on your Dojo if you're already connected.

For new users, once I receive your e-mail address and enter it into the system I will send you an invite and then you will be able to download the free app that will connect you to our class. Please don't try to connect before I send you the invitation.

If you were connected last year everything should just "roll over' automatically. If you are new to the system you cannot connect unless I have entered your e-mail address.

To Parents/Guardians of Grade 7, 8 and 9 Students:

Our Board of Education has authorized the teaching of the elective unit Theme V, Human Sexuality to Grade 7, 8 and 9 students as part of the Alberta Education Health Curriculum. The new Health and Life Skills K-9 Curriculum under Personal Health W-7-3, Under Safety and Responsibility W-7-12, 13, 14 have the Human Sexuality Portion as a mandatory part of the curriculum.

The purpose of the Human Sexuality Unit is to help students acquire some basic understanding of bodily changes, which may occur to them now or in the near future.

Parents retain the right to exempt their child from school instruction in Human Sexuality education. If you decide that you **DO NOT** wish to have your child work in this area, please inform the school by **NOTE** within **TWO WEEKS** of receiving this notice. Alternative arrangements will be made for any children not participating.



Instructional Hours:

Elementary: 332 minutes per day x 174 days (-720 minutes for early dismissal) = 57 048 minutes (950.8 h)

Secondary: $351 \text{ minutes per day x } 174 \text{ days } (-810 \text{ minutes for early dismissal}) = \underline{60.264 \text{ minutes } (1004.4 \text{ h})}$

Kindergarten: 332 minutes/ day x 89 days (-720 minutes for early dismissal) = 28828 minutes = 480.5 h
