INTRODUCING...Viking School's new I C.A.R.E. awards for elementary students. We recognize that many of our students are living our "We C.A.R.E. Everywhere" vision every day at school and we believe that this needs to be acknowledged and celebrated. 

attendance information is currently available online through Maplewood Parent Portal. This information is updated on an ongoing basis and provides current attendance information along student mark summaries. There is a link to the Parent Portal website on the Viking School homepage. If you have forgotten your username or password for the online system please email MaryAnn Newby at the school for that information.

For days of inclement weather (when busses do not operate) Viking Schools procedures remains the same as previous years: Regular classes for secondary students will be cancelled and a study hall will be set up with rotating teacher supervision. This will allow students a quiet place to work and teachers of various subject areas will be in the room throughout the day to provide academic support. The shop, home ec. room and gymnasium will not operate on these days for secondary students. For elementary students, classes will be combined as necessary and follow an alternate schedule for the day.

Cold and flu season is also now upon us and we ask that you do not send your child to school if they are exhibiting flu-like symptoms. If children are in attendance at school it is our expectation that they are well enough to participate in all regular school day activities including physical education. Students who are not well enough to attend school will not be able to attend extracurricular activities, as it is important for them to rest and recover.

The Annual Education Results Report for Viking School is now complete and was shared at the School Council meeting on November 20th. It will be posted on our website and can be found by clicking on 'About' and then 'School Plans and Reports'.

The final exam schedule for January has been set and is included in this newsletter.

The Christmas concert will be held on December 17, 2019 with performances at 1:00 pm and 6:30 pm. To facilitate safe student transportation we ask that those who plan to attend the afternoon performance ensure their vehicles are removed from the parking lot before busses arrive at 3:10 pm or park somewhere other than the staff parking lot.

Please come and join us for the next School Council Meeting on Wednesday January 15th at 5:30 pm in the Home Ec. Room.

Christmas break will take place from December 20 – January 5. There is no school for students during this time and the school will be closed. Classes resume on January 6th.

Battle River School Division is pleased to offer you the option of viewing and paying your fees online by credit card. Parents/guardians can view and pay fees for multiple students in a single transaction.

How do I use the Student Fee Online Payment System?

- Log in to the BRSD website at www.brsd.ab.ca
- Click on "Menu"
- Click on "Families"
- Click on "Online Payments & Ordering"
- Click on "Online Payments & Ordering". Note: if you require additional assistance, a user guide is available on this screen.
- Click on "Sign-Up" to create an account. You need an email address to sign up. A student ID number and last name for each of your students is required. The student ID number is located on the invoice above the total due amount.
- At the fee summary page, click on each student tab to review fees. Any optional items that can be added to your shopping cart will be listed at the bottom of each student's page.

- Other features include the ability to print a statement and/or receipt
- When ready to check out, click "View Cart" followed by "Pay Now." You will be prompted to enter your payment type and required information.
- You will receive a copy of your receipt via email (sent to the email address connected to your parent account).

Please monitor your online account as additional fees may be added throughout the year (i.e. second semester fees, field trips, sports fees, etc.)

Is there a cost to use the Online Fee Payment System?

No, there is no convenience charge assessed for online payments.

What are executive functioning skills?

- Executive functions are the skills that allow us to:
 - organize our behavior over time,
 - plan and organize activities,
 - sustain attention,
 - complete tasks and manage our emotions
 - These skills DO NOT fully develop until our mid 20's. Children need our support!

Why are executive skills important?

Executive skills help to REGULATE BEHAVIOUR.

HOW can parents support their children with development of executive functioning skills?

- Establish consistent routines
 - Use visual schedules and checklists
 - Use timers to aid in motivation to complete tasks
 - Use an agenda to track due dates of assignments, exam dates and assist with handing in homework on time
 - Use a highlighter to remember important information
 - Use a binder with dividers to assist with school work organization
 - Use different colored folders to support organization of school work
 - Use a 'reminder app' on a cell phone to support memory to complete tasks
 - Night before preparation for the next day's tasks
 - Practice, practice, practice
- Feedback: REMEMBER 4:1.
 - Give 4 positive comments for every critical comment or direction.
 - Be specific about what you are praising
- Teach each skill don't just assume that they will "just learn it"
- Ask questions and cue to encourage them to think about what they're doing
 - What did we just do?
 - How did it go?
 - What would you do next time?
 - Praise and reinforce the attempt not the result!


